<b>Placement</b>	FY2 Haematology
<b>The department</b>	Haematology
<b>The type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>The trainee will gain experience in clinical management of patients with Haematological problems, interpretation of haematology investigations, blood and marrow films, blood transfusion and haematological procedures including bone marrow biopsy.</p> <p>There are multidisciplinary meetings on Tuesday, medical lunchtime meeting and an x-ray meeting both once a week.</p>
<b>Where the placement is based</b>	George Eliot Hospital
<b>Supervisor(s) for the placement</b>	Dr Mekkali Narayanan (currently off), Dr Jhansi Muddana, Dr Imran Manjra and Dr.Ali
<b>Main duties of the placement</b>	The trainee will undertake ward rounds and attend clinics as part of the haematology team. There is a commitment to provide clinical cover for the Haematology ward as required by the consultant haematologist. Middle grade cover will be provided by the staff grade.
<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	There will be provision for twilight (11-7pm) cross cover duties in acute medicine one day a week.
<b>Employer information</b>	<p>George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation.</p> <p>There are approximately 286 beds, including eight critical care beds, 12 day case beds and a coronary care unit with 11 beds. There are 14 inpatient wards. The trust has eight operating theatres providing planned and emergency surgical facilities for trauma and orthopaedics, general surgery , urology and gynaecology. They also offer a wide range of day case procedures, for adults and children aged 2 to 16 years old</p> <p>There is an Education Centre (GETEC) with excellent library facilities, Simulation Suite, a Clinical Skills Centre and numerous teaching rooms including a Lecture Theatre.</p> <p>There is a very strong commitment to junior staff training</p>
