The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Trainees will learn to take a sexual history and examination of the genitalia. They will learn the diagnosis and management of more common Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI's), testing for STI's including HIV and the associated patient counselling and contact tracing. They will gain experience in dealing with confidentiality issues and management of vulnerable people.</p> <p>Education: Journal club, medical grand round and radiology meetings each occur at lunchtime once a week. FY2 will be able to attend when they can. There is a protected structured teaching On Tuesday afternoon at UHCW. There is protected time for Audit, CPD and research at the GUM clinics on Friday afternoons 2.00 – 5.00 pm.</p>

Main duties of the placement	The trainee will attend clinics at George Eliot and Rugby St Cross before seeing patients on their own once they had adequate training, and a senior doctor will always be available during clinic times for advice.

Employer information	<p>George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation.</p> <p>There are approximately 286 beds, including eight critical care beds, 12 day case beds and a coronary care unit with 11 beds. There are 14 inpatient wards. The trust has eight operating theatres providing planned and emergency surgical facilities for trauma and orthopaedics, general surgery, urology and gynaecology. They also offer a wide range of day case procedures, for adults and children aged 2 to 16 years old</p> <p>There is an Education Centre (GETEC) with excellent library facilities, Simulation Suite, a Clinical Skills Centre and numerous teaching rooms including a Lecture Theatre.</p>
