<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	9am ward rounds every day. Ward jobs. Attending MDT and Grand round. Reviewing pts on other wards. On call commitments roughly as follows: 1x session of 1st on call covering A+E (2pm-9.30pm) 2x session of 2nd on call covering the ward (twilight shift 2pm- midnight) Nights 12 nights during a 4 months rotation.
