Placement	FY2 Emergency Medicine
The department	Emergency Medicine
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The trainee will gain experience in the emergency management of a wide variety of medical conditions, including trauma. Multiple trauma cases are seen at UHCW. The trainee will have an opportunity to practice and learn principals of suturing, IV sedation and analgesia, reducing limb fractures and dislocations, x-ray interpretation, and management and resuscitation of the acutely ill patient.. There is a weekly teaching programme for A+E F2's. There is also a departmental weekly teaching session.

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr David Foroughi Dr Dorothy Apakama.
Main duties of the placement	The trainee will be a full member of the junior trainee workforce. There is a comprehensive induction programme into the specialty.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The trainee will be involved in the shift pattern rotation as for all A+E junior trainees. At night the trainee will work and be supervised by a senior member of the team and both are covered by a Consultant on call.
Employer information	George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation. Currently there are 350 beds divided between the major specialities. There is a new Postgraduate Medical Centre with excellent library facilities, a clinical skills training unit and a computer skills training centre. There is a very strong commitment to junior staff training
