The department	Haematology
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The trainee will gain experience in clinical management of patients with Haematological problems, this includes general and malignant haematology as well as thrombosis cases. Apart from this, interpretation of haematology investigations, blood and marrow films, blood transfusion and haematological procedures including bone marrow biopsy.</p> <p>Once weekly on a Tuesday, haematology multidisciplinary team meeting (MDT) takes place. On a Wednesday the medical lunchtime meeting takes place in which various medical specialties discuss interesting cases. The lunchtime meeting is also approved for 1 CPD point by the Royal college of Physicians. The x-ray meeting takes place once a week on a Wednesday.</p>

Main duties of the placement	The trainee will undertake ward rounds and attend clinics as part of the haematology team. There is a commitment to provide clinical cover for the Haematology ward as required by the consultant haematologist. Middle grade cover will be provided by the staff grade.
Typical working pattern in this placement	There will be provision for twilight (11-7pm) cross cover duties in acute medicine one day a week (usually on a Monday).
Employer information	George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation. Currently there are 350 beds divided between the major specialities. The Postgraduate Medical Centre has excellent library facilities, a clinical skills training unit and a computer skills training centre. There is a very strong commitment to junior staff training
