Main duties of the placement	The trainee will join the team of orthopaedic junior trainees to provide orthopaedic care to inpatients and outpatients. There are opportunities for ward work, outpatient clinics and to attend both elective and trauma theatres.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The trainee will be part of the orthopaedic on-call team.
